Sylvie Casher becomes a bat mitzvah

The extended biography of Abraham and Sarah continues into a second weekly portion. While the previous section, Lech Lecha, focused on the establishment of the b'rit—covenantal relationship—between God and Abraham, this section moves to events in the lives of the Patriarch, his wife—the Matriarch Sarah—and their children Ishmael and Isaac. We read two chapters—Genesis 21 and 22—on Rosh Hashanah. They are so rich in content, in moral questions and in setting fundamental elements of the relationship between God and the future Jewish people, that even a few weeks later, rereading these passages forces consideration of human action and personal decisions in a challenging world. Yet, embedded in this internal narrative, there is also the deeply significant agreement between Abraham and the Canaanite chieftain Avimelech. Like them, we live in the context of our times. Like them, the Genesis narrative illuminates the relationship between people sharing life experiences while holding different understandings of meaning.
