‡Rory Pihony Becomes Bat Mitzvah

The extra-long weekly portion Naso opens with detailed listings of the elements of the portable Mishkan to be carried by members of the tribe of Levi, that is the cousins of Moses, Aaron [and in our understanding, Miriam]. The text only lists men—in the usual mode of the patriarchal structure of those times—and the order generally follows the birth order of the descendants of Jacob through the mothers—Leah and Rachel—and the variously listed concubines. The inequity of the esteem granted those women is uncomfortable despite the legitimacy granted to all the children by their father's status and stature. The text reiterates the concern with ritual impurity, skin eruptions and a society of health. The role of the Kohanim in monitoring—even treating—such disruptions of social norms is central to the sacred society in the wilderness, though not to be confused with public health. In the instance where the scourge is lifted, or when a sacrifice is brought the three-fold benediction appears as an invitation that remains potent: the greatest blessing a person can enjoy is summarized in these words offering shalom—an internalized completeness—as the promise Jewish can bring. May we merit that blessing in our modern, complex, secularized lives.
